## The simple past tense: regular verbs

We use the **simple past tense** to show action that took place in the past and finished taking place in the past. To write something in the simple past tense we change the verb from the simple present tense to the simple past tense.

We add -ed to some **regular verbs** in the simple past tense.

**Example:** I play soccer. → I play<u>ed</u> soccer.

We can also add -d or -t to some regular verbs in the simple past tense.

Examples: I arrive home. → I arrive<u>d</u> home.
We learn English → We learn<u>t</u> English.

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## The simple past tense: irregular verbs

Remember, we use the simple past tense to show action that took place in the past and finished taking place in the past. To write a past tense sentence we change the verb in the sentence. Some past tense verbs are **irregular**.

**Examples:** We <u>write</u> sentences. — We <u>wrote</u> sentences. They hang pictures on the wall. — They hung pictures on the wall. Her mother <u>sings</u> in the choir. — Her mother <u>sang</u> in the choir.

You need to learn irregular verbs. The verb *to be* is an irregular verb that you use often. Take note of how this irregular verb changes in the past tense.

I am. → I was.	We are. — We were.
You are. —► You were.	You are. → You were.
He/She/It <i>is</i> . → He/She/It <i>was</i> .	They <i>are</i> . ──► They <i>were</i> .
