Common nouns and proper nouns

Common nouns name everything that we can see, hear, smell, taste and touch. Common nouns do not start with a capital letter unless they start a sentence.

Example: Some <u>people</u> enjoy climbing <u>mountains</u>.

Proper nouns name specific people, places and things. Proper nouns always start with a capital letter.

Example: Table Mountain is in Cape Town.

The fireman is very strong.

Collective nouns name a group of the same type of people or things.

Examples: a <u>herd</u> of elephants
