Personification

Personification is when a thing or animal is compared to a human and given human feelings, abilities and qualities.

Example: My dad's car <u>drinks</u> petrol.

A car is not a person and cannot drink. However, because the car uses a lot of petrol it is compared to a person who drinks a lot.

Alliteration

Alliteration is the repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words that are close together to create a specific sound or rhythm. Alliteration can also help create a mood or feeling. Letters like b or c can make a hard sound. Letters like m or n can make a soft sound and can help to create a gentle mood.

Example: The \underline{b} ook fell with a \underline{b} ang and \underline{b} urst open.

The alliteration of the b sound emphasises how loud the noise was.

Example: The \underline{m} oonlight \underline{m} elted into the \underline{m} ist.

The alliteration of the *m* sound creates a soft, gentle mood.
