

Sentence types: statements, questions, commands and exclamations

Statements tell us something. Statements begin with a capital letter and end with a full stop.

Examples: It snowed today. Monica is a good mother.

Questions ask something. Questions usually begin with words such as *who*, *what*, *when*, *where*, *which*, *how* and *why*. Questions begin with a capital letter and end with a question mark.

Examples: How old are you? Where do you live?

Commands give orders or instructions. Commands begin with a capital letter and end with a full stop or an exclamation mark.

Examples: Sit down. Stop now!

Exclamations are used when a person wants to emphasise something they say. Exclamations begin with a capital letter and end with an exclamation mark.

Examples: I said you must be quiet! I ate too much!

Negative sentences

We use **negative sentences** to say we did not do something or if we want to say “no” to something. We can use *did not* and *does not* to write negative sentences.

Examples: She took an apple. → She did not take an apple. Notice how the verb changes.

He has to do the dishes. → He does not have to do the dishes. Notice how the verb changes.

Negative sentences often use the words *no*, *not*, *can't*, *won't*, *don't* or *didn't*.

Examples: No, I don't want to go to the party.
 I won't buy sweets.
 Yusuf can't write his exam.
