## Similes and metaphors

A **simile** compares two things using the words *like* or *as*.

This dirty <u>room</u> is <u>like</u> a <u>pigsty</u>. **Example:** 

The <u>room</u> is <u>as</u> dirty as a <u>pigsty</u>.

A **metaphor** compares two things by saying that one thing is another. A metaphor does not use the words *like* or *as*.

**Example:** This room is a pigsty.

## Personification

**Personification** is when a thing or animal is compared to a human and given human feelings, abilities and qualities.

**Example:** The volcano <u>burped</u> out a cloud of dust.

Her dark hair swallowed all the shadows.

She ordered the day to retreat

while she took control of the streets.

A volcano can't burp; only living things can burp. But a volcano can suddenly send a cloud of dust into the air which makes it look like it is burping.
