

Writing descriptive paragraphs

The aim of descriptive writing is to help a reader to imagine or experience something you are describing. Descriptive writing provides the reader with a picture in words. You can make your writing more descriptive by:

- using descriptive language such as adjectives and adverbs to add colourful details.
- using figurative language such as similes and metaphors.
- using words that appeal to the five senses so that readers can hear, see, taste, touch and smell what you are describing.

Example: Read the following descriptive paragraph and notes.

These adjectives appeal to your sense of sight.
