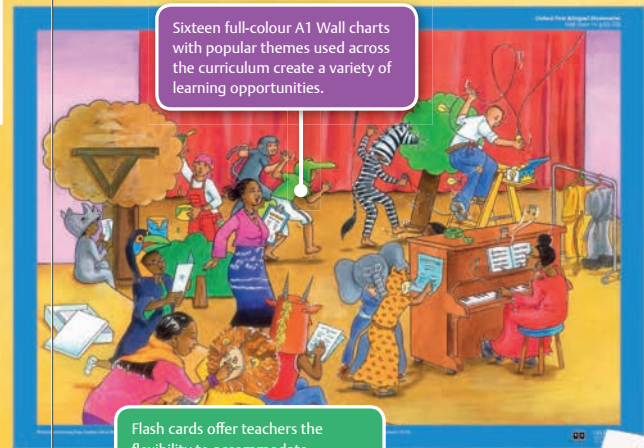


The colourful Wall charts highlight themes used in the *Oxford First Bilingual Dictionaries*. Use them with the Flash cards to help learners learn multiple languages.

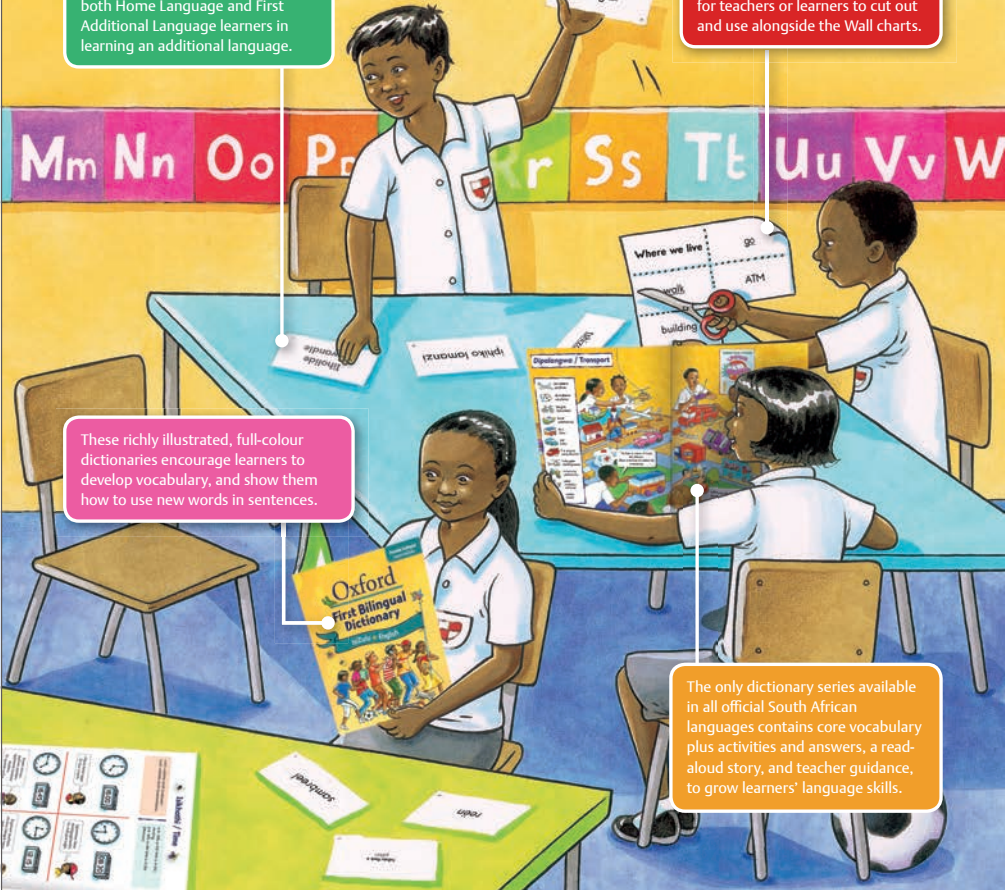
A free User guide supports teachers and parents in using Wall charts and Flash cards together with the *Oxford First Bilingual Dictionaries*.

Flash cards contain the relevant page reference to the *Oxford First Bilingual Dictionary* to help learners match words from multiple languages.



Sixteen full-colour A1 Wall charts with popular themes used across the curriculum create a variety of learning opportunities.

Flash cards offer teachers the flexibility to accommodate both Home Language and First Additional Language learners in learning an additional language.



These richly illustrated, full-colour dictionaries encourage learners to develop vocabulary, and show them how to use new words in sentences.

Flash cards are fun and easy to use. They are presented on sheets for teachers or learners to cut out and use alongside the Wall charts.

The only dictionary series available in all official South African languages contains core vocabulary plus activities and answers, a read-aloud story, and teacher guidance, to grow learners' language skills.

The Wall charts and Flash cards are perfect for learning an additional African language, as will soon be required by the Incremental Introduction of African Languages (IIAL) policy.

- This will mean that all learners must learn an additional African language.
- Learners who already speak an African language at home need to choose an additional language from a different language group.
- These implementations will start in 2015 in Grade 1 and will be introduced to one further grade every year thereafter.
- Many of the IIAL themes can be found in the *Oxford First Bilingual Dictionaries*, e.g. My home (Inside our house), My body (Look at us!), My birthday (A party).
