Glossary

anaphylactic shock: a serious condition in which blood pressure drops rapidly; the person could die from cardiac arrest unless adrenaline is administered quickly to open airways

apprehended: arrested for a crime

appropriate: suitable for the occasion or circumstances

arbitration: a means of resolving conflict

capital: an initial investment by the owner to start a new business;

carbon footprint: the total set of greenhouse-gas emissions caused by an organisation, event, product

or person

carcinogenic: cancer-causing

catwalk: ramp at a fashion show on which models have to walk and display the clothes

co-infected: simultaneous infection by two different pathogens

collateral security: if the loan granted does not cover the entire purchase price, the seller may be asked to assist with collateral security from another source

competitive edge: a feature, quality or other element that makes the business different to other similar businesses

compound interest: interest calculated on the principal loan amount plus the interest still owing

contract: a legal agreement between two or more people that is tacit, verbal or written

cooling-off period: the amount of time the law gives a consumer to consider the implications of a contract and cancel without reason or financial penalties

corporate: designed for, suitable for or associated with people who work for large firms

counterfeit: an illegal copy of a product

CPI: consumer price index is the measure of the average price of a specific group of products

culprit: somebody who is responsible for or guilty of an offence or misdeed

demographics: the characteristics of a population; it includes factors such as location, race, age, gender and employment

depression: a period in which an economy is greatly affected by unemployment, low output and poverty

desalination: a process of removing salt from sea water to make fresh water

dress-code policy: a document drawn up by a company to specify the type of dress that is acceptable for their employees

entry-level salary: the salary offered to a person who has just started work

exemption clause: a part of a contract that frees the supplier from blame or responsibility

forfeit: lose property or rights as punishment for a fault or mistake

fossil fuel: energy from the sun stored in ancient plant matter and found within rocks of the earth's surface

grey goods/parallel imports: goods that are sold through unofficial channels in a country where the manufacturer does not wish to sell

guarantee: an assurance from the manufacturer that the product will remain in working order for a specified period of time

hypoallergenic: a substance or foodstuff less likely to cause allergic reactions

immovable property: property that cannot be moved, for example land, buildings

implication: a likely conclusion or result from something although not openly stated

inappropriate: not suitable for the occasion or circumstances



income tax: an amount of money paid to the Receiver of Revenue according to the amount earned in a year

indelible: permanent, impossible to remove or wash away

inflation: the percentage at which the price of goods and services increases

ingestion: the consumption of a substance

inhibit: to stop something from developing or continuing

innovative: creative and original

innuendo: an indirect remark or gesture that usually carries a suggestion of impropriety

insolvent: not having enough money to pay your debts

instalment sale or hire purchase: the goods purchased are taken for use immediately, but the amount

is repaid over time in specific monthly instalments

insured: a person taking out an insurance policy

insurer: the insurance company

interest: the money the bank charges you for borrowing money **intravenously**: the administration of a substance directly into a vein

jaundice: yellowing of the skin and the whites of the eyes

jurisdiction: the geographic area in which the law may be applied

lay media: untrained or unqualified reporters or journalists

legal consideration: usually money, but can be anything that is regarded as valuable to the parties involved, for example property, loyalty credit, barter or other goods and services

LPG: liquefied petroleum gas, a fossil fuel made from natural gas found deep in the earth's rock formations

mortgage bond: contract where a bank or financial institution provides money for the purchase of a house or land and the consumer pays a specific monthly amount over time to repay the debt movable property: property that can be moved, for example vehicles, furniture

obsolete: no longer in use; out of date

PAYE: Pay-As-You-Earn is a method of collecting income tax where the employer deducts one-twelfth of the calculated annual tax due from the employee's salary or wage before it is paid to the employee

phishing: the dishonest activity of sending emails to trick people out of their money

pollution: the presence in the air, soil or water of a substance with unpleasant or harmful effects

prevalence: the proportion of a population found to have the condition

proof of residence: any document that can prove that a person lives where he or she has indicated, for example an electricity bill from the local municipality

prophylactic: an agent, device or substance used to prevent disease

provisional tax: tax paid on estimated annual income twice a year

purging: methods intended to reverse the effects of binge-eating

pyramid scheme: non-sustainable business model that involves paying participants for enrolling other people into the scheme

rates: a tax on land and buildings paid to the local authority by the owner

recession: a period shorter than a depression when there is a decline in economic trade and prosperity **regenerative electricity**: source of this energy or electricity quickly renews itself, for example wind,

water, sun

retrospective: going back into the past



scam: a dishonest scheme

sedentary lifestyle: a lifestyle involving minimal physical activity **simple interest:** interest calculated on the principal loan amount only

skewed: uneven or distorted

solar energy: energy derived from the sun's heat, for example for heating water

stealthy: behaving in a cautious, sneaky manner so as not to be seen

stokvel: a community-based savings club

SWOT analysis: close examination of the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats that a

potential business must adapt to or use

tacit: understood or meant without being stated

target market: the specific group of people who will be willing to purchase the product

therapeutic: healing, restorative and relaxing

title deed: the legal document that proves you are the owner of the property; it includes the location

and size of the property as well as the owner's particulars

triglyceride: a type of fat in the blood; high levels increase the risk for diabetes

upcycling: the process of converting waste materials or products into better quality materials, new

products or products with higher environmental value

uranium: a mineral used to manufacture nuclear power

VAT: Value Added Tax, currently 14%, is added to the selling price of goods and services and is

collected from businesses

waning: decreasing gradually

warranty: written guarantee to repair or replace an article if it breaks or does not work properly
