

THINK WHEN YOU READ

Activate prior knowledge

Use what learners already know about the world or other books to help them understand better.

Ask questions

Encourage learners to ask questions about the story and engage higher order thinking skills.

Find the main idea

As they read, teach learners to find the main events or the most important information.

Make predictions

Allow learners to guess the rest of the story and then read to find out if they are correct.

Visualise

Teach learners to make a picture in their minds as they read.

Check understanding

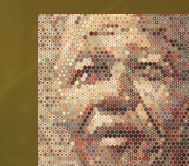
Stop learners while reading to test if they have understood.

Make inferences

Tell learners to look for clues to understand what the writer wants them to understand.
