



Complete a timeline

 - b These are only suggested answers. Learners can come up with other relevant examples: Thato: supportive – he helps Luzuko with his 'job', he helps Miracle when Prof. Grasso shouts at her; reliable and loyal - he is always on time for rehearsals, he is there when his family needs him, he finds Luzuko when he goes missing; shy - he gets tongue-tied around Miracle, he is too shy to ask Miracle out; talented – Prof. Grasso tells him he has a special quality; determined – he insists on an audition; romantic – he kisses Miracle in the final act of the opera; spontaneous – he sings on top of the train, he kisses Miracle on the steps of the college Luzuko: confident and charismatic - he is popular with girls, has lots of friends, others are jealous of him; talented – he is a very good baritone; resourceful – he finds ways to earn money to pay for college; superstitious – he believes someone has cursed him; secretive – he doesn't tell anyone about the trouble he is in; outgoing – he sings at Mama Afrika and the tourists love him; intense - he believes someone is out to get him; proud – he doesn't accept financial help from Miracle
 - c Opposites attract. They have a lot in common, but their differences also complement each other, e.g. Luzuko is confident with girls and Thato is shy, so singing with Luzuko at Mama Afrika boosts Thato's confidence.
 - d Learners could cover the following points:

Thato and Luzuko are both talented opera singers and good friends. Although Thato is shy, it is clear that he is more reliable than Luzuko. Luzuko is charismatic, but Thato is someone who can be counted on in a crisis. When Thato sings on the roof of the train, we can see that he is spontaneous and passionate. This tells us that he is very determined to reach his goals. In the end, Thato and Luzuko are still good friends even though they are very different.
